Situated near Wooler in North Northumberland, the College Valley is one of the gems of the Northumberland, and contains the Cheviot Hills, wild goats, key hill fort sites and ancient Bronze Age settlements and is also home to very rare vegetation and wildlife including red squirrels.

The College Valley was also the home of Admiral Lord Collingwood and has been featured in Vogue, BBC1 Secret Britain programme and has been described by the Times as 'the quietest place in Britain' and 'a thrilling revelation.'

**The Bursary Scheme will award students up to
£1,000 for a two week study**

The scheme is open to those studying a range of disciplines including: geography archaeology, marketing, environment, agriculture, biological studies, marine sciences, natural sciences, travel and tourism.

There is accommodation at the Valley in the form of a 24 bed well equipped bunkhouse. Students must provide their own transport.
